Restricting access to the park by allowing organised sport to use the facilities would appear to be at odds with both the definition of "Local Open Spaces" as described in the Mitcham Council Community Land Register" as being an area that "provides easy access to the local community" and with the original intent of Mr Smith in making the Park available to all members of the community without restriction.

To establish a permanent sporting facility here would require a reduction of the natural environment to construct facilities, fencing, carports, lighting etc. There would be traffic issues to be resolved. The negative impact on the habitat of wildlife and natural waterways would be significant. I believe that the current community use of Frank Smith reserve should be maintained. There are new sports fields being developed on Shepherds Hill Rd. There are schools in the district with established sports fields. The Frank Smith reserve is a unique environment and should be preserved in its current state.

Strongly disagree	It isn't needed. It will increase vehicle traffic. Sports fields require expensive maintenance, water, fences. Just walking about is exercise. Organised sport favours men. Organised support favours those able to afford the 'gear' needed. When these groups take over a space for their exclusive use, they exclude other users; we can't take the kids for a wander in the middle of a match. Open spaces can be just open spaces. They don't need to be a business, and organised sport IS a business.
Strongly agree	It's a great location and yet seems underused. Hewitt Oval sees very high use, but we have this great location and asset and are not using it.
Strongly agree	This is a great shared space, it would be good to see it used more. Local sport is so good for the community
Disagree	The native regeneration at the creek-end will be for nothing if they can't be enjoyed as a peaceful, quiet space away from cars and noisy activity. My kids run like crazy across the lovely flat area, we're not dodging footballs or feel like we're in anyone's way. The reason locals choose to live here is because they want to enjoy the big green spaces. Not worry about their toddler running into a car park or club game.
Disagree	Saturday sport at FS park is extremely noisy and disruptive of the tranquillity generally enjoyed by other users. The admission of traffic between the main gate and the oval can be quite dangerous to other park users, especially to those with small children or dogs.
Strongly disagree	I think the current capacity is substantial for the park, any more would offset the balance in users and decrease the beauty that is captured at Frank Smith.
Agree	I feel it is great for the oval to get used but I would very strongly disagree if there was some space cleared (eg trees being chopped down) to make a carpark or for the lovely natural grass which is so good for the ecosystem, animals, birds etc to be replaced with artificial turf.
Strongly disagree	I am writing to you to express my concern over the future plans for Frank Smith Reserve. I am very much against any major development of this piece of land, which was donated to the Community, by a local farmer many years ago. The land was donated so that the local Community could enjoy the peace and tranquillity that this Reserve offers. A walk through this Reserve provides a stroll like no other because the Reserve is still very much in its natural state there are kangaroos grazing on the oval, koalas in the trees and birds of all different types. I am aware of people who just like to sit in the Reserve and enjoy its tranquillity as well as being able to walk their dogs without the multiple rules and regulations that are found elsewhere. Groups of people gather on the oval to enjoy morning walks and talks with their dogs. The Coromandel Valley School enjoy the oval for their Saturday sports amongst other things but on a small scale. There are so many local families who just enjoy the lake and feeding the ducks! If this Reserve was to become home to a much larger sporting group or other there would be

	cars, clubrooms and other infrastructure plus the huge amount of noise that usually is associated with sporting events. All of this would drive the fauna away. What we have is a "real gem" one that is almost impossible to find given that everyone wants to establish, develop and subsequently ruin a natural wonderland. Please leave our Reserve alone to be enjoyed for generations to come just as it is. If you do what you plan to this Reserve, I for one will not return to use it because it will be somewhere I would not wish to visit like so many other areas that the Council has so called "developed"
Agree	Do not object to organized sport being played at this facility, however Parking and the provison of appropriate facilities needs to be made, given current lack of these.
Strongly disagree	I am ok with sporting use itself, however, not if this comes with car parking, buildings and other permanent infrastructure which detracts from the unique setting.

	Furthermore, while less easily quantified, there is a trend away from organised sport to recreation such as that which is enjoyed in natural settings. This should be considered.
	Thank you for the chance to have a say.
Disagree	I am concerned that with increased use, there will increased traffic requiring increase parking, there will be increase in littering and general lack of nature respecting activities. The local wild life already have to share with us and by dramatically increasing the usage of the park, there is increased chance the habitat will be disturbed. We also do not want any further loss of trees and we suspect that with any development plans, there often is a cull of trees.
Strongly disagree	It is a local park used by local families, and has native wildlife. It is not in keeping with the area.
Strongly disagree	Should be kept a place ALL of the community

Agree	A great area which is currently under-utilised by the community. More and varied activities would enhance the value of this asset but coordination of the various interests will be necessary otherwise we will get into one another's way.

I do not want any trees to be chopped down, concrete paths or bridges put it, lights put in or artificial turf used. Once a sporting club gets a lease they would want to make those changes.

Agree	There is a shortage of space for junior sport in the area. I agree to a limited increase in use of the park for junior sport
Disagree	Our family have lived in this area for 15 years and frequently visit Frank Smith reserve. We are concerned about the safety implications due to increased traffic, especially for families using the bike tracks and walking in the area. The grass surface struggles to cope with the weekly use during a short school soccer season. The additional use this season on Sundays for a longer club soccer season will ruin the grass surface. Also there will be impact of increased parking on the grassed areas adjacent to the road, this will compact the ground around the trees. The road into the oval is already of poor quality and will be further degraded by the traffic. The increase in usage by organised sport will restrict access for other visitors to the area and reduce the amenity of the natural environment. Also we are concerned about the degradation of the Sturt River if that water is used to irrigate the oval.

It is a very enriching environment for our dog and ourselves and we love that we are able to experience the beauty and nature of the area on our visits. We often see many species of animals and birds too and it is a very peaceful environment. There is a real sense of community here and whenever we visit there is always other dog owners around and it is the only place locally that we have made connections with others from the area and we know all of the dogs that frequent the park and their owners. We don't yet have children but know that when we have a family, that this is the perfect place for kids to explore. We have brought our nieces and nephews here to engage in nature play and they absolutely loved it. On the other hand, there are plenty of sporting ovals, complexes etc in the area and those areas are obviously unable to be used for exercising our dog during their use for sporting activities so by allowing sport to go ahead at Frank Smith, you would be

	taking away an option for us to take our dog to and there are no suitable back up locations in Coromandel Valley, Blackwood and surrounds if we are unable to use the park.

It's one of the only spaces I feel safe taking my dogs off the lead. They love it there

There is a very diverse bird population in the park representing something quite rare in the Mt Lofty Ranges. Impacts on it should be considered

This was left 'to the people', not to a club. It's important that this park which is casually used by many in the area honours the intent of Frank Smith by remaining open and available to all, not put aside for a club or clubs

As previous, keep it available for all, not just those involved in organised sport.

It would be sad to see the park over used/developed as currently the quiet natural surroundings are the most attractive feature. I don't think I've ever been through the park without running into dog walkers and it would be incredibly unfortunate to ruin the amenity for this group. I think a good balance could be easily struck. I would hate to see open access to vehicles as I think the current arrangement of access to limited groups when using the facility works well.

The probable supporting infrastructure will take away from the natural feel of the area and the spontaneous use of the oval and its surrounds by the many people whom I see there each time that I go.

More people using the facility will make me feel safer when I go for a walk.

Not limiting the use of the area for dog walkers/exercise, considering only the use of one oval for organised sport

Interesting question.

There are no concerns using a sporting ground for sport.

Do you have any additional comments about the use of Frank Smith Park?

Frank Smith is a beautiful natural reserve. It has an abundance of wildlife and provides shelter to a number of species threatened within an urban habitat (eg bandicoots). The wetlands provide a natural filter for the water that runs into Sturt Creek and the whole area provides local families and the school with a beautiful learning environment. Organised sport should be kept to a minimum so as to not disturb the nature of the area. The area itself is not suitable for any further development (the grassed area atop the hill is not suitable for parking). It cannot support extra parking, or infrastructure without significant impact on the delicate ecosystem and it's surrounds. Please respect the wishes of the local community over the wants of a homeless sporting club who continually push to develop over nature for their own gain and greed.

A bridge over the river in the north eastern corner of the grounds is a REQUIREMENT if any development is to take place. The crossing is impassable in winter and dangerous at other times.

I am heavily involved with school sport at CVPS which uses Frank smith for cricket and soccer. It is a wonderful setting however the grass is often far too long for a junior game of cricket - mowing more often would make a huge difference to the playing surface for what would be minimal cost in the short term. I believe if clubs want to use the ground they could contribute to an upgrade of the playing surface.

The land was donated for horse riding and is now mainly used for walking, fishing, picnics and dogs socialising. Please do not ruin this by having more sporting events. Belair National Park was not allowed to nor should Frank Smith Park.

Being a resident of Coromandel Valley for over 50 years and growing up and knowing Frank Smith and family, the land was left for the community to enjoy. it was sad to see the current oval being installed, even worse was the upkeep of the facility disappear to leave an unusable surface. If the oval can be improved and maintained with little change to the parks current 'ambience' it would be ideal. Being aware of the lack of sporting ammenities available I think if no improvements are done it won't make any difference to the situation. If it gets improved it will be an eyesore of fences and signs and the usual council moves to protect them from being sued. Such as the installation of signage and life rings at the dam...... Shame mitcham council.

The boundary fencing is inadequate given its use as an off lead area for dogs and the neighbouring livestock.

Consideration for maximising amenity for people use (beyond sport). This might also include identifying future expansion (if opportunity arises) during adjacent property sub-division(s) Deliberate exclusion of motorcycles (off road) and intent to limit excessive noise should already be in place.

Link to Blackwood Forest should be marked (and promoted).

A link path south to Ackland Hill should be considered as a future possibility.

Upgrade of ovals would be good but leave be the natural environment out the back. It doesn't need sanitizing or suburbanizing. Its beauty is in naturalness

Parking is already an issue, particularly around school drop off/pick up times. Not sure how, but definitely need improved access and more parking in this area.

The park was saved from development to create a peaceful environment for the community and nature to enjoy.

Any development or impact on the Park will be strenuously rejected.

Path lights would be useful

We have been a regular at Frank Smith Park for many years and enjoy catching up with all the other people and their dogs that use the park on a regular basis ,There are many people who use the park to socialise their dogs as we haven't got another park nearby.

I have enjoyed Frank Smith Park for nearly 50 years. It was my childhood playground. There are already more than enough ovals and sporting infrastructure facilities in the local and wider area that are under used that can accommodate all organised sports. Leave our open spaces and natural environment alone. People need somewhere they can go where they can have some peace and quiet to experience the sounds of nature, birdlife, fauna, flora etc. Enough is enough!

The park is fantastic as it is, nature play for kids is fantastic. Creek crossings without sterile bridges make it adventurous and fun.

I would be concerned if the gate off Magarey Rd (which is currently locked outside of the times the oval is currently used for sport) was to remain permanently open. This area is a lovely safe place for the kids to ride their bikes and play after school.

If the oval is to be used for more organised sport, it would be helpful if there was some sort of advanced notification as to what days/times etc so I can be sure to avoid riding my horse on the adjacent Tom Roberts trail at those times.

Access across the water course at the back of the oval.

Very difficult to negotiate safely and dryly.

I would love the addition of a nature playground at Frank Smith Park

There are plenty of ovals in City of Onkaparinga, so why take a popular local facility away from the locals? Let it be an informal area for picnicking, dog walking and enjoyment!

Existing amenities support organised sport until a later time when funding can be sought for new, first priority should be the upgrade of the playing surface.

At times the soccer parents get rather loud especially with a southerly wind. We back onto the north side of the Park

Organised sport is supported but the primary purpose of the park should be as a natural native environment. Therefore limited infrastructure and more flora and fauna care.

Please reconsider allowing increased sport in this area from these large sporting clubs. These clubs already have sufficient facilities to meet their needs - for example, the Sturt Lions Football Club has recently gained commitment from the government to have a \$275,000 upgrade made to Manson Oval in Bellevue Heights, and this is on top of their \$2,750,000 Karinya grounds!

When you give these grants to these massive clubs to use these beautiful public spaces in this way (for their own financial gain), you are actually taking the spaces away from the local kids to be able to use them on their weekends. If there are sporting games on every Saturday and Sunday at Frank Smith, when can our school-aged kids go and play here? We regularly go here to kick the footy around on the lawn, our toddler runs around, dogs enjoy the free space. If the grounds will be

occupied by the Clubs during this time, the community can't go and play on the oval, there will be a huge number of cars going up and down to the oval, damaging the paths. The increased traffic will have a flow-on effect on the wildlife here, which is a very special and untouched little area that deserves to be left alone. We currently take our children to Frank Smith every weekend and have done for years - surely you can't think it is right that we suddenly have to stop using this beautiful public spot, so that a soccer club that already has a \$2.75 million dollar grounds (among MANY other grounds) can take over it and have it cordened off for their own use?

Further development to Frank Smith would be to the detriment of the incredible wildlife that are living in this small but undisturbed area - Southern Brown Bandicoots and orange-bellied parrot have been spotted here, which are both highly endangered. Increasing cars and foot traffic right next to the wetlands, on the oval, would be of a huge detriment to these animals, especially if there were night games to be held due to the influence of light pollution.

Lastly - please - keep Frank Smith open for ALL of us to enjoy over the weekend. These clubs have ample facilities and have no respect for the environmental damage they cause. If you allow them to take over Frank Smith for their own financial gain, the next thing they'll be asking for is to cut down trees for carparking, then flood lights, then bigger toilet blocks, then a massive clubroom, and then our treasured area of undisturbed nature will be lost forever. Areas like these are the reasons why people move to the Adelaide Hills. Please keep them natural for our children to enjoy as openly and freely as it currently stands.

Also, if you go ahead and allow Frank Smith to be taken over by organised sport, you won't hear the end of this. There will be larger community uproar then what you seen when Sturt Lions tried to do this to Belair National Park.

Please encourage this club to look elsewhere. We protected Belair National Park and now we must protect Frank Smith.

Play ground upgrade is all that is needed, but don't remove the metal equipment- no old school playgrounds around any more!

So long as the park is still available for other users I don't see any problem with more organised sport on the oval.

An upgraded playing surface is urgently required for growing sporting clubs in the area to ensure new kids/players are attracted to sport, but of vital importance to retain existing kids/players. Also of great importance is the building supporting facilities, which include public toilets, changerooms, canteen and all weather shelter. These could be completed in separable stages. Other upgrades or improvements should include; BBQ shelters, seating and upgraded playground facilities.

Parking would be a major problem. There is not enough parking to support increased use and trees and the environment would need to be damaged or destroyed to increase parking.

Margary road could not handle increase in traffic, it's practically a single lane track as it is.

Leave it as it is please.

Accessible toilets with baby change facilities are a necessity

Grew up on adjoining property and relative of Frank Smith. All for improvements but do not support synthetic surfaces.

The wetlands area is so special with abundant small bird life and I am concerned about the negative impact of concentrated and additional activity surrounding the playing field

Do not touch the gum tree. You know the one. Leave it and all others alone. You can improve this oval without making it look like a. Urban carpark with an oval.

It's currently very popular with dog walkers off leash. It's great to see all the dogs run free whilst friendly people have a coffee and a chat. I would hate to see it change to on lead only if sport becomes the main use.

Why wasn't this done earlier

The social value of the park is enormous, especially for people who are socially isolated and/or not included in formal sporting organisations.

A large number of people use the park for dog walking and nature time, often forming friendships with other casual users.

Dogs should be allowed off lead. If this is a problem for other users, it could be limited to particular times and/or areas.

Should be advertised more, unless you grew up in the area it is well hidden

Fantastic space being under used in our council area

Please leave it as is, it is so popular at the moment for the natural feel it has don't mess with it.

It is one of the best parks around with a nature walk part, a creek etc. it is the best park to go to to have dogs socialize off leash without being contained in a small fenced dog park. The entire area should have a fence around and be declared a dog park

I would use this space more if dogs were on leash. I have had issues with dog aggression and muddy dogs jumping on me. I do not think this is a suitable off leash area.

The area needs this, a very welcome proposal.

While I support community sport, I really appreciate the quiet nature if the park. I'm not sure what the correct balance should be.

I think of Frank Smith like it's my own backyard. I have lived nearby for the last 19yrs, and depending on my availability have walked there daily to currently a few times a week.

I have formed networks of fellow dog walkers which grow into friendships. There is a community of people who are equally passionate and appreciative of Frank Smith as it is.

The only upgrades I see Frank Smith needing is better management of the dam intake output flow and a crossing of sorts for the creek in the far back corner behind the wetlands. I would prefer something less obvious as a proper bridge, large heavy stones similar to what is used in Sturt Gorge is my thinking.

My joy at Frank Smith is the old scrub and the new plantings that are replenishing the cleared areas.

This of course brings a great variety of birds to the area, including a Tawny Frog mouth family we have been following since 2009. More recently a kingfisher has made the creekline his home.

I have concerns for the increase in use of the oval to outside sporting groups. My observations so far have not given great confidence that consideration is given to the community who already use this space. Cars speed in, probably lost and late. Parking is haphazard along the grassy edges, no care for the damage it creates. Kids are often unsupervised in vulnerable areas.

I'm not against sports groups using the oval, I am against this concept that to do so upgrades must happen and particularly at expense of the natural environment and those who use the space more passively.

I'm preparing myself that Frank Smith as it is will be lost to the locals and handed over to the ever demanding needs of vocal sporting clubs. If this happens it will be a great loss to those who have enjoyed it as it is for many many years.

If this is due to Sturt Lions wanting yet another field to take over then it should be rejected, while I am also a member of Sturt Lions I am a member of the CV primary school and Blackwood Forest FC too. Sturt have taken every available pitch with no consideration of true grass roots sports, they dont share with other local groups either.

Blackwood have been forced to relocate to Springwood because Sturt have been allowed the privilege of all the local pitches (they wouldn't share one of their pitches as one extra match might have been too much for the grass)... but obviously money talks!

Put the money into Frank Smith for the true local sports and schools (CVPS, BelAir etc)...and leave the Sturt Lions monopoly out of it.

Can we stretch the budgets to lights for winter?

I believe it makes more sense to work with current use and enhance the park to facilitate that use.

Please leave it as is- a quiet space for people to take their kids and dogs without too much sport going on. There is no where else nearby for local residents that is suitable to let bigger dogs off lead to play and socialise with each other.

Perhaps council could spend sometime getting the top pond up to scratch again given the Reid's have taken over and there is no water flow.. I remember a great little jetty that led to clear water.

While I agree with using the space, sports take up all available outdoor recreational space. Some of us need outdoor space that is peaceful as with infill housing, you can never get away from the noise/busyness of an increasingly fast pace life. The area is trying to rebuild the habitat for native flora and fauna, increased sports/vehicles is not in keeping with this agenda. Support the use for Quiet peaceful activity like outdoor yoga classes etc

I don't understand why there needs to be a consultation when it was clearly established as a sporting and recreation park. The local area is full of kids needing an outlet.

Increased use of the sporting fields would appear to be a reasonable use of the facility. Changing the infrastructure by redeveloping any of the area would be an awful shame. The majority opinion on social media appears to preference leaving the area alone. Users enjoy the natural aspects of the area and don't want to see bridges, paved areas, increased vehicle access or other development. They enjoy the park as it is.

The major potential conflict I see with increased use of the sporting fields is with dog owners. As a dog owner myself, I am not concerned by this as there is ample space elsewhere in the park. Increased vehicle access, if this was being considered, would be inappropriate with the number of school children crossing from Coromandel Valley Primary School, and park users running, riding and walking their dogs through this area or using the adjacent cricket nets and jump tracks. Increased car parking would be a good idea if it were confined to Magarey Road.

I don't think this could go ahead without sorting out the parking and making access easier at busy times out of the road. It's a nightmare just at school times.

Surface could be better for sport. Upgrade toilets for everyone. Minimise built infrastructure. We have too many areas being spoilt by this policy. Keep in mind that it is for everyone to use not just sporting clubs. If the public can't use it then what's this point?

I daily use Frank Smith Park to walk the dog. There is a large group of people who attend to let their dogs play often. This is great for community engagement, social activities, and leisure. I believe that consideration needs to be had for a dedicated dog play area at Frank Smith. There is loads of room with water features. There is NO dedicated dog play area in the local area.

Simple fenced area that is not associated to the sporting grounds would be ideal. If you increase sporting activity, then there will definitely be conflict with local dog owners who need to get out of the house to walk the dogs. If sporting is increased, dedicated dog or mutual off-lead areas need to be designated also.

It works fine as it is as a playing surface

There is a lot of activists who send out false information especially on Facebook to provide a perception the public don't want change but this couldn't be further from the truth

Community veg garden space would be great

Please do not take this away from the kids. This is a fabulous space that can be shared with everyone.

There are so many other locations organised sport could occur. Why are we always encroaching on the valuable natural green space we have?

Keep it as it is - green space & natural habitat. A great place to exercise and be in nature.

It is a beautiful place to visit anytime of year on the fringe of suburbia..a natural playspace.

Prioritise the natural environment over commercial gain, these spaces are disappearing quickly and it is such an asset to the community.

Young families and sport need to be considered.

There should be another bridge connecting the hill path and the path around the wetlands

You will have to have rubbish bins there.

It's a wonderful area for wildlife including koalas. Koalas are a threatened species. Too many vehicles and people in the park would have a negative impact for them.

don't turn this into a sporting area.

it's a busy area as it is with the school nearby. Magary road can't cope with increased traffic

It would be very disappointing to see action taken to make any significant changes without a lot more community consultation. My mother was one of a number of locals who stood in front of the bull dozer that was contracted to fill in the damn many years ago. As a result of their protests, which were against council wisdom at the time, we have an amazing community park that balances sport, nature, local industry (the orchard) and our local primary school - enhancing the quality of life for people, pets and wildlife.

Under used increase in cricket would be good

I said it all before

During the current sporting activities, the gate is opened and cars have access to the park, often parking on the grass near the oval. In winter, this causes the stone-surfaced road to deteriorate into a muddy slick, and the grass parked becomes degraded. There remains water-filled mud-holes to the east side of the oval during the winter, which were pointed out to council TWO CUSTOMER SURVEYS AGO and with no rectification. How hard is it to fill these minor stretches with a trailer-load of earth? I am concerned about additional activities due to the impact of more cars using the park each week.

The wetland area has deteriorated over the past 7 years, and the park as a whole would benefit from a volunteer "management committee" representing all stakeholders to liaise with council.

There is rubbish on the North side which needs moving for safety. Iron on and bribed wire. The top area is less used.

Turning these spaces into private club use is a terrible use of public space.

Our family often uses the park for walking and exploring on weekends. It would be nice if the organised sport didn't interfere too much with other recreational users of the park on weekends.

The Wetlands are an amazing but neglected space with access across the creek damaged since floods occurred some years ago. I would like to see investment here.

it is a very nice place for an oval that is going to waste and with an upgrade it can be used to its full potential, and it would be nice to see it upgraded and used for more sport.

Will the club who collect fees be required to invest in the park to ensure ongoing use for everyone not just their players? Will bins be emptied more to accommodate greater use? Will no trees/green space be removed?

I'm happy to share the park and see physical activity encouraged but use should be balanced.

Please leave it as it's is.

Frank Smith Park would benefit from some improvements and upgrades to areas such as toilets, picnic benches, childrens' play area and the addition of outdoor gym equipment.

I think it's fine to increase use of Frank Smith Park for organised sport as long amenities at provided for the scale/frequency if use of he park and as long as current use of the park is not significantly impacted (e.g. ability to walk the dog, bike on the dirt tracks, etc are not significantly impacted).

It will turn a sanctuary into another loud space where the environment will be lost in the cheers.

I would like to see this area remain s shared use facility

I can think of a better use for this space than supporting local community groups.

See earlier comments. Don't ruin a good thing, the infrastructure spend is going to be in the millions of dollars, but for how long? I'm talking about resurfacing roads and oval, lights if training is proposed, building of change rooms, possible upgrade to play equipment, better toilet block, water for oval as there is no current irrigation, noise reduction for residents i.e. high fences or window alterations. Who is paying for electricity, water if soccer goes ahead? Alterations to intersection at Main Road and Ackland Hill Road. Weekends only, no training Monday to Friday.

I would like the playground to be updated :-)

Parks need to be used to be valued

If the park is designated for increased use by sporting groups the parameters for usage should be clearly defined, understood, monitored and adhered to. In particular the times of day, for example only from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Also with a maximum number of hours per week and per day allowed, for example 10 hours per week and no more than 6 hours per day for a single organisation. The intent being for community access to continue as the major use.

Please, please, please keep this beautiful and very important open public space just for that - open public space. To grant exclusive use to one particular club that has very high fees excluding many, would be terrible and would go against the intended use of this space and indeed, the use of this space for many decades. Why should the community lose out to one particular club?

I enjoy the park and i would like to see a nice bbg and tables

I dont think soccer should be there. For multiple reasons.

- 1. They have just completed a multi million dollar facility in Blackwood and have use of another oval nearby which has been given money in the recent election to improve. Also there is a big difference between using an oval during winter and summer. Summer won't require lights. Winter will and will also damage the ground more as the ground will be softer.
- 2. Sturt Lions have the facility on Coromandel Parade already.
- 3. I think there are better options to provide opportunities for different sports to use grounds in the area considering they are so few and far between.

Please add further street lighting to the entire road. And speed bumps to slow down extra traffic. Keep opening the gates to the oval when the games are on to help with parking.

My wife and I live in The Knoll Crescent, only a short distance from the park and use it regularly ourselves as well as bringing our seven grandchildren there regularly. I bring dogs there regularly there too. I do appreciate the doggy bags and bins.

I feel strongly that use of the oval by any club must be secondary to any use by the adjacent primary school. In other words, any AFL, cricket or soccer etc. by local junior teams from the Coromandel Valley Primary school must come before the Sturt club. The school is very old and built on a very small site, so needs access to the Frank Smith Oval.

Over the years children, teachers and parents from the school have planted and maintained the

many trees that have been planted over a 20 year period or more. Many of us pull weeds and clear sticks from paths as we use the park.

As a retired teacher, I see a real shortage of ovals for junior sport since the last two governments sold off open space at a number of secondary and primary schools.

Any use of the oval must prioritize use by the Coromandel Valley Primary School which is on a very small site and since the BER, much of the oval space at the school is taken by the new school hall. It no longer is able to be used for junior football.

Primary school students, parents and teachers have for many years planted the slopes around the oval and looked after the new plantings. I remember helping our children and grandchildren take many many containers of water to water the young plants summer after summer to keep them alive.

Make sure there's play equipment for young children

Frank Smith Wetland is a hot spot of biodiversity for both flora and fauna in the area. It is secluded from busy areas and offers protection for animals in an otherwise relatively urbanised area. It is currently abused by some dog owners treating it like a dog park with little to no regard for the local native plants and animals. I do not have an issue with increasrd sporting events on the oval, however the wetlands and surrounding area needs to be safe guarded first. Keeping dogs on leashes would be a fantastic start as well as better signage about the importance of places like Frank Smith in urban areas. The Onkapringa Council has spent thousands on revegetation and conservation who have done a fantastic job at holding backs weeds and encourgaing local plants to thrive. I am concerned that an influx of visitors would undermine this great work done by contractors and the council.

Furthermore, if there is funding available to invest on sporting grounds I would hope there is sufficient funds to reconstruct the wetlands into a functioning wetland. The wetland was badly damaged from the 2016 floods and to the best of my knowledge nothing has been done to restore it to a working wetland.

I hope that the council can continue to recognise the importance of biodiversity and protect Frank Smith from further damage.

Its a fantastic opportunity for this park to not only be used by local sporting teams, but to also attract attention that could lead to the uplift of the park and its facilities. This would benefit the local sporting community (sporting clubs, school sports etc) and the surrounding community who visit the park regularly.

Love the area. Would be good to see something done on the area to make good use of the available space and the fact it is located a good distance away from any public housing.

Due to the heritage of the area it is very hard and unusual to see any new structure la or facility in the area. Which is incredibly disappointing as it prevents the area from growing with the rest of the community's. I love the area and I love the quiet nature but it's time we finally have some wins to the local clubs in the area which can have great affects for unlimited amounts of people and not just the residences near by who may be mildly inconvenienced by the situation from time to time.

I think it is a perfect space for community sport, away from houses and traffic. Plenty of walking trails around Frank Smith dam and the surrounding area so community sport should be allowed access to a quality oval.

Frank Smith Park is a delightful and peaceful feature of Coromandel Valley. It would be disappointing if there were a significant increase in the level of use for organised sport as that tends to limit access by the general public.

Fantastic suggestion

The creek and wetland space is so beautiful and highly valued by locals that it would be best to maintain that. Also the bikes jumps are used regularly and all weekend by young teenagers. It would be ideal to maintain the safety in the area and not have to compete with increased traffic for children or dogs off leash.

Go back to the drawing board. Use some common sense and stop ruining natural areas. Residents love this area because of what it is currently, don't ruin that!

I support the use of Frank Smith park for additional sporting commitments. My main concerns however are the current lack of 'ownership' on who is responsible for maintaining the park to ensure lawns are mowed, fields are marked, QR codes are easily available to sporting associations/school sport organisers. If an increase in sporting occurs here there needs to be a clear understanding/commitment from either Mitcham or Onkaparinga council about who's responsibility it is for the ongoing maintenance and to ensure grounds are ready every week for sports.

Please do not disrupt what is one of the last relatively "untouched" parklands left in the area, I don't want to see the natural landscape restricted and developed.

I have no problem with it being used for sports but the right infastructure needs to be considered with consideration for the surrounding flora and fauna.

Support for allowing children's school sport as already occurs, on Saturday mornings. No upgrades to turf that prevent other users..ie. astroturf for soccer which excludes other uses. No permanent goal posts which impact other sports. No support for increased adult sport clubs or club houses due to likely increased partying and alcohol. The area is already being used for illegal activities such as letting off fireworks and there is regular drinking and discaeding of bottles. A serious bushfire risk and evacuation concerns for the entire area. Its very difficult getting onto Main Road during rush hour, let alone in a bushfire. The surrounding natural environment was being damaged by increased visitation during COVID lockdowns, giving an insight into potential damage with increased use. Many snakes in the area which should be allowed to have their habitat protected, and many nesting birds in adjacent trees and shrubs. No support for sport at night activities.

Use of this area has already increased greatly over the last 10-20 years. This area should be preserved as one of the last remnants of native bush land and a safe place for locals to explore and enjoy without worrying. We live in the street and also have huge concerns over the increased traffic with cars regularly speeding down the round with no concern for the locals. This will no doubt become worse with this change!

This space was gifted to council by a local family, and is enjoyed by many everyday as it is.

Please put the "dogs must be on a leash sign" back up.

I love sport and it's good for everyone. But changing the nature of Frank smith park is not a good idea. I support the use of it for school and on weekend only. The road to the park is so narrow and dangerous for many cars going in and out of that road.

I think it needs to be kept to minimal sport use so that this doesn't take over from nature activities. There are other sports facilities recently created in Blackwood and o'hallaran hill. I would think that housing sports away from nature reserves would be more sensible.

I walk there every day and I have tried numerous times to get a bridge built over the creek but neither council wants to pay for this! I have even met somebody down there from Onka. council to discuss this - but it all goes quiet. This has been going on for years. As soon as a soccer club wants to use the oval (and pay the council presumably), the council snaps their hand off! Perhaps in June 2022 when both Onka. council staff meet with Mitcham council, this can be discussed? Surely the councils can share the cost of this?

Open space and nature are becoming rare commodity in our ever expanding residential area. This particular soccer club has currently has multiple locations in the immediate area. Hewett Ovall, Manson Oval, use of several schools in the area as well as their \$3million development on Shepherds Hill Rd. There is a site next to Women's Playing Fields at corner of Ayliffes Rd & Shepherd's Hill Rd. That site could accommodate all their needs and not impact the environment, better traffic flows and zero impact to residents.

It's the only place left that you can walk a dog off the lead. Lets keep it that way. There are plenty of sports ovals near buy.

Develop flagstaff hill where it's already built up. Leave the valley as one of the last natural areas

I live in the area which has some outspoken people who want nothing to change. I have lived here 40 years and recognise the need to give both adults and children the facilities to play sport without the need to pollute the world by having to drive away from the area to partake. It is a vital provision in line with government ideals and medical advice to get outside off electronic devices and exercise. Frank Smith park is one of Mitcham Council's woodland reserves and as per the City of Mitcham Open Space Strategy (2001), this area needs to appropriately managed by considering "regional as well as local habitat protection objectives". It further states that where there are watercourses, poor land management can impact habitat downstream therefore the "involvement of the Patawalonga Catchment Water Management Board in this regard is essential." Additionally, "it is also necessary

that dialogue with natural resource planners from adjoining Councils is developed and maintained".

As such, I would expect that the City of Onkaparinga has done due diligence in consulting the Patawalonga Catchment Water Management Board as well as engaging Natural Resource Planners from adjoining councils to ensure that the introduction of organised sport and its associated infrastructure does not have a negative environmental impact on the natural habitat of Frank Smith park and surrounding areas including habitats downstream from the watercourse.

There are enough sporting facilities in the Onkaparinga area, would like to keep Frank Smith for casual dog use and social community outings

This survey seems very biased in the response options available. It is very focused on more organised sport. There are no questions about accessiblity for older people or the very young. Or for sports that aren't competitive.

Use it for coromandel valley primary school parking & stop the drop off area in the school. There are traffic problems on main road when picking up & dropping off children. It has become very difficult & dangerous to use the road around the school area.

Even though I support its use for organised sport, I would like to see the natural and wild feel of the space preserved. That is, any developments being really sympathetic to the environment, and parking not too far into the park.

While some increase in use by sporting clubs may be balanced with current use, I do not think any building works or substantial change to the area should be considered. The value of the park for walking, bike riding and nature play should be preserved. The constricted nature of Magarey Road does not allow for any significant increase in traffic.

More cars, more noise, more dogs off leash. Please leave our park alone! Main road can barely handle the traffic we already have.

We have used Frank Smith Park for many years to exercise and socialise our dogs. Our dogs are jumping out of their skins when they realise we are turning into Magery Rd....to go to the park!

It may be good to utilise this wonderful area for sport provided it is not overdone & consideration is given to the other current and future uses of this wonderful area.

It appears parking on Magarey Rd and also the nearby inside areas beyond the boom gate are sometimes used by parents of Coromandel Primary children, this is understandable due to limited parking facilities but a more organised approach perhaps involving more clearly defined parameters would render the practice safer for all concerned.

Please never put in artificial turf, lighting, new bridges and concrete paths, chop down more trees, add buildings or car parks. We moved to the hills to be able to enjoy the trees, open spaces and natural environment. The animals have so few places left to go (I believe there is a Brown Bandicoot that is native to this area). A sporting club will want to make these changes and I do not support this.

Please never add buildings, concrete paths, bridges, lights, car parks, artificial turf or cut down any more trees. The animals have so few places left to go, if these above things were added it would be bad for the them and push them out (I believe there are Southern Bandicoots there). We moved to the hills to be able to experience open spaces, trees, and our natural environment and so do not want any changes or anything added to this previous and unique and rare area.

The primary use of the park is as a nature reserve. I would strongly disagree to any changes in use which would impact on this. Specifically I oppose any major infrastructure changes which would impact on its natural environment and wildlife. The park is an open space amenity for the general public and no sporting club (s) should have any exclusive use age which will reduce the use by all sectors of the community.

Even though we are members of Sturt Lions soccer club we do not support the increased use. The school soccer season is of short duration, whereas the club soccer season is much longer. I have already witnessed the chaos and reduced safety associated with cars arriving for a Sturt Lions trial game. It is a narrow no-through road, with limited parking. There would be limited access for other visitors during games. Frank Smith reserve is a fantastic place for multiple activities and connecting to nature, we don't want that to be negatively impacted.

I don't mind the ovals, sometimes we bring a ball and have a kick, but most of the time we wander up to the ponds and the kids muck about in there for ages.

Locals love our area because of its natural serene environment, we don't want it developed for profit, leave it alone.

It's a wonderful park with great mixed use at the front with the bike jumps, the creek and pond are beautiful and it really adds to Coromandel Valley Primary school and the OSHC to have access to such a great place close by. But I've seen that private residents need to bring their own lawnmowers from home to cut the grass before weekend soccer. That seems ridiculous for a council maintained park. This space doesn't need lots of upgrades, but a regular mowing cycle, better/more parking and some commitment will see this used by the regular dog walkers from 8am-midday weekdays be happy and the weekenders for sport also be happy. I'd hate to think that a few dog walkers will ruin any chance of even minor upgrades because they see it as their space. Grandstands, change rooms etc I think might be too far given the secluded nature of the park but if it does win funds to upgrade the grounds for weekend sports, the toilet facilities will need to be expanded given the increased volume of people attending at any given time.

It's an extremely valuable resource for the community, and highly valued by the school as a natural resource to be used for Science and other lessons. It is very important to me and many others that the integrity of the natural environment is maintained, and that at least some times on the weekend are left free from organised activities.

There are already many sporting ovals around the area. At the moment finding somewhere to exercise a dog when sport isn't on is quite difficult. If it were to be used for sport, it would be great to have a timetable available online so people can see when not to take their dogs there / use it for general rec.

Increased parking availability would be a huge asset and support to Coromandel Valley Primary School, where parking is very limited and causes major disruption and road rage along main road during pick up and drop off times.

This is not a suitable site for increased traffic and use. Please do not go ahead with proposed plan it will have a huge impact on our community.

I wholeheartedly support this initiative and hope it gets off the ground.

Frank Smith is a very large tract of land, which could easily incorporate all uses eg organised sport on the weekend, dog/horse exercise and nature areas

CVPS has long utilised the Frank Smith Reserve for both sporting and educational purposes. Any development should ensure such use is not negatively impacted.

There is significant lack of parking for any increase in Club use of the location & as such increased use would negatively impact those living close by including myself.

As a neighbour and frequent user of Frank Smith Park, one of Coromandel Valley Primary School's volunteer soccer coordinators, and parent of 2 kids who also both play school and club cricket, I really hope a reasonable compromise can be reached here.

As it currently is, Frank Smith is a wonderful, safe, natural environment through which I can ride my horses, my kids can safely walk or ride to school, and play with their friends after school and on weekends. It (just!) holds up over the winter soccer season with the number of games the local schools play on it without turning into a complete mud pit! (Frank Smith is also the home ground for Belair and Eden Hills primary school soccer teams).

Unfortunately, I feel that under its current maintenance program it is unsuitable to be used for school cricket. As council currently classifies it as a recreation ground, not a sporting ground, it is on a 6 weekly council mowing schedule. This is highly insufficient over the summer months when the grass is actively growing. We were out there with our own lawnmowers and whipper snippers over the cricket season to enable the kids to play on a surface where the ball could actually be seen, let alone make any sort of progress across the ground surface after it had been hit!

I would be in favour of improvements to the oval surface, even if it's just in the form of more regular ongoing maintenance, but I would not like to see an increase in organised sporting use if that, in turn, is going to lead to a significant increase in vehicular traffic within the park and along Magarey Rd. The impact this would have is very evident at school drop off and pick up times at present, while the school is using the park as a kiss and drop zone whilst repairs are done to the wall near the usual kids and drop zone at the front of the school. I am quite strongly against the area directly inside the first gate being used long-term as either a drop off/pick up or parking area. It feels quite unsafe to me as it is being used at present.

Hopefully there is a compromise to be reached somewhere? My suggestions would be:

- 1. The gates remain locked at all times when the oval is not in use for organised sport
- 2. The use of the oval for organised sport to be scheduled to always avoid the hours around school pick up and drop off times
- 3. More frequent maintenance of the oval surface, gravel roads and parking areas directly around the oval itself
- 4. No parking allowed near the bike track or on the grass next to the gravel tracks

Maintain natural focus and atmosphere for all people to enjoy equally, not just a specific sporting organization.. No open space should be lost to new developments. No artificial surfaces should be used either.

The playground, bike track, cricket nets, dam and creek need a lot of TLC and upgrades

Facilities for drinking water

Yes when mr smith died he left that area to the Children of Coromandel Valley to be enjoyed now and in the future. Every one is fine with the school using it for sports because they are the children of Coromandel Valley but they only play once a fortnight on it and how are kids supposed to use their imaginations if they have no where to go and explore.

I support more use of the park, but hope it could be done in a way that is sensitive to the local environment and residents.

The only upgrade I would like to see is a slight expansion on parking, and widening of access gates for emergency services

Would be great if the school could use to more often too.

Coromandel Valley PS uses this park for orienteering while after school orienteering is also provided including students from nearby schools.

People shouldn't be selfish and share the use of the park

It's a beautiful space and needs to retain that beauty but I think enhancing the area with better facilities will ultimately ensure the longevity of the park as open but usable space

This is a highly used area for parents of Coromandel primary to use for before school and after school pick up,so any organised sport should be after 4.30 pm to give parents time to collect their kids. Also, the primary school uses Frank Smith weekly on Saturday during soccer season and cricket season so they should be given priority since Sturt already have use of several other ovals and pitches. Main road is extremely clogged at school pick up time do again, if it is to be used by other clubs it must be after 4.30 pm

It is good to know the oval is getting good usage. I know Frank's main desire for the land was for children to enjoy it. As long as there won't be some restrictions or the like (say, if a club wanted to block off an area, etc), then I think any turf upgrades, financial assistance would be good.

An extensive nature playground for families

National parks in Australia protect areas of natural beauty including the plants and wildlife that live there, and provide access, recreational opportunities and educational programs for people to learn about these natural habitats.

Think of our future generations and protect their future as well as all the flora and fauna.

Improvement of the oval grass, watering in time for cricket and school sports day, and Primary School kids sport.

Not against increased sporadic use. Not organised, every weekend use so that the community can not use it.

I think the bike tracks (BMX and Jumps) could be extended, improved, and maintained to a higher level to include Frank Smith Park with the ever growing range of bike tracks and trails available in the Adelaide hills.

this is a unique area and does not need to be spoilt.

Please leave it!

It's a great open space useful for so many things! I am open to changing the oval, please keep the paddock at the top and the wetlands!!!! It's good to see the park getting some love. Please don't ruin one of the nice spaces where we can do recreation.

The South Australian Cricket Association strongly supports the improvement of Frank Smith Park for cricket to be played at the site into the future.

The overuse of FSP will ruin this beautiful open space.

The access is simply not suitable for continual sporting events. Vehicles picking up students from Coromandel Valley PS already fill the roadway twice a day. Magarey's heavy vehicles have had their access blocked. Sporting clubs will obviously want to build lots more infrastructure and it will soon take on a commercial appearance regardless of whatever promises to the contrary are made to council.

My children attend Coromandel Valley Primary school so we are regularly at Frank Smith Reserve and Park to enjoy nature and play after school and for school soccer on weekends.

I think improving the quality of the turf for the current and future users would benefit the community and would be a good thing. Some of the other facilities would also benefit from improvements such as the toilets and playground area. Improvements such as these could be easily carried out without impacting on the look and feel of the place as it is currently.

My main concern in opening up the park to sporting clubs and making it busier is that any developments need to be sensitive to the natural environment.

For example, if it is decided additional parking is needed, I am concerned this will be at the expense of some of the green reserve area leading up to the park (near the cricket nets area).

Additionally, I think adding amenities such as seating and change room facilities could damage the look and feel of the park/reserve.

Also access should be a consideration, in some sections access is narrow and challenging (room for one car only). This can also be an issue near the entrance gate especially when people are parked on the road due to limited parking spaces. If the demands on the park are greater, improvements may need to be made for vehicle access but this should not be done at the expense of some of the beautiful trees and natural areas.

While the park is used for school sport, it is also largely popular due to its natural beauty and the surrounding reserve. It is a very popular spot for walkers, nature lovers and for families due to the natural aesthetics of the park. Therefore, any development must take the needs of these users into consideration as well as those using the park for sport.

Preserving our natural environments is of the upmost importance and so if a development does go ahead it needs to be a very careful and sensitive balance.

Please don't change it. We love it just how it is and the community of people who use the park just how it is. It will be a real shame to lose the community we have.

Frank Smith Park is a little gem with beautiful birds and animals. A lot of people including us use this area for walking, off lead dogs with control, bird watching and just simply playing. This is a little communal place to get to know locals also. I would like the council to put more effort in conservation - bringing back biodiversity but allowing people's access rather than building up new infrastructure for sporting clubs. Increasing car access, lighting (if Sturt Lions puts up lights for winter soccer training like they did at the soccer pitch recently developed on Shepards Hill Road and Hewett Oval on Coromandel parade) will have a massive impact on the animals live there. Ongoing noise will be carried through to the residential area also. Increasing car access will have a big impact on the plants and animals - I have seen a koala on the tree in the area recently opened up for parking. Coromandel Valley Primary School children for example use this space for nature play during the school hours. It can be a place to care and nurture the natural environment. I would like to see Frank Smith Park to be a beautiful nature reserve rather than sporting facility.

we support the ongoing development of our area that benefits all people and future generations. the proposal to upgrade / utilise frank smith for sports is a fantastic idea.

in order for this to be safe, the road into and parking needs to be considered as bitumen. and better bollarding to be installed to prevent hoons from driving onto the oval.

There are enough soccer pitches and other sporting grounds around our area. Leave this park alone.

The exit from Magarey Road onto Acklands Hill Road is so close to the Main Road intersection that it can be quite dangerous as so many people who access Acklands Hill Road from Main Road take that corner at a high speed. In my opinion, the extra traffic leaving Magarey Road from organised use of Frank Smith Park will lead to many potentially bad accidents.

Stop organised sport use of Frank Smith Park!!!

The traffic coming onto Acklands Hill Road from Magarey road and waiting then to join Main Road will be a nightmare and create a very dangerous situation. Let the people play

It is a beautiful spot that should be used as much as possible but retain it's natural charm

As a school sport organizer I worry about the safety of the ground. Car parking isn't marked out and the road is unsealed.

The education department is also a stakeholder- at least 3 schools use the ground for soccer.

Frank Smith is a beautiful park that is environmentally valuable. Frank Smith is one of Mitcham Council's woodland reserves and as a result needs to be appropriately managed and protected. I urge the Onkaparinga Council to reconsider the use of the park by organised sporting clubs. This is not an appropriate use of this park and I would ask that the clubs in question which have approached the council review other more appropriate areas including school ovals. This is a park that should be enjoyed by all the community and not just sporting clubs. The Council needs to ensure the preservation of our parks as community space is vital for the mental health of people, the enjoyment of environment by the community and essential in protecting our local fauna and flora (keep in mind a climate emergency has been declared in South Australia.)

Frank Smith park needs to be protected and preserved. I understand one of the clubs, Sturt Lions, is requesting the use of this park and I question how much community space this club needs? Mitcham Council have already given this club Karinya Reserve, including major upgrades - leave this park alone and leave it for the enjoyment of all the community in its natural state.

With a growing population in the area it would be great to further activate community space for the greater and wider community. Participation in sport and recreation has a hugely posatve flow on to the community.

Best to make sure the open spaces are being used by all people - casual, organised sport included

I would like to say that a 'Master Plan' without any defined proposal or scope is difficult to comment on and could be viewed as a disingenuous exercise in asking a leading question looking for a favourable answer.

Frank Smith Park (FSP) is currently well-used and equitably shared by members of the community for various pursuits. It works well to this end, in it's current state.

Any development or improvements need to consider the vagaries of the intended proposal such as access, egress, parking and impact on built, educational, agronomy (Magarey's Orchard) and natural infrastructure.

The volunteer historians at Watchman House, run by the National Trust, has detailed an 1840 'Native Reservation' (apologies for the antiquated pejorative) near the site, similar to the site at Weymouth Oval (at the junction of the Chambers and Sturt Creeks). I respectfully ask if there has been Kaurna input into this proposal?

The proponents of developing FSP would decry NIMBY-ism and a lack of foresight should this get knocked back, those of us that value a quiet, shared-secret, of high community value would disagree. Once it's gone, it's gone.

Any time a change in management of a community space is proposed it is polarising, yet we all have the same aim to use a community space. It should be maintained as a shared space, not metaphorically fenced for exclusive use that excludes us as ad-hoc users.

In the short term, those that propose to develop FSP would seem dismayed if nothing happens. In the long term, with hindsight as a benevolent ally, here's hoping we say we've done the right thing by leaving it as it is.
