

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

CLARENDON RECREATION PARK MASTER PLAN 2020

BACKGROUND

Council has been working with key stakeholders to develop a draft master plan for the Clarendon Recreation Park. Once finalised the Master Plan will provide long term direction for the site to ensure the current and future recreation sport and leisure needs for the residents of Clarendon and the surrounding communities are considered.

When will the actions be funded?

Projects will be placed into council's Project and Capital Works program and prioritised subject to city wide priorities and future Council budgets.

Once the community consultation process is finalised what are the next steps?

We will review the feedback and finalise the Clarendon Recreation Park Master Plan. This will then be presented to Council to endorse in August 2020.

Will the existing oval space be affected by this plan?

As illustrated in the map the Clarendon Recreation Park Master Plan shows the retention of the oval space. A small 2m wide strip will be required into the future for when the tennis/netball courts are rebuilt to ensure they meet the new player runoff safety standards. This will have no impact on the oval and/or it being suitable to be used for junior sport including soccer, football and cricket.

What are the main outcomes of the master plan?

- Retention of the values that are important to the community and make Clarendon Recreation Park a highly valued community asset.
- · Formalising carparks.
- Upgrade to park furniture.
- Improvements to path networks.
- Vegetation management.
- · Landscaping.
- Improvements to the area in front of the pavilion.
- New playground near to upper courts.
- Improvements to the access and egress from the Park to Kangarilla Road.
- Upgrade to interpretive and direction signage.
- Linking the Over 50s Club and Hazel McKenzie land to the rest of the park.
- Working with SA Water to improve their land between the bakery and the ford crossing.
